**Walk One Saturday 27.10.12**

2:06 – 2:39pm | 33:34 | 2072 steps

From Studio to summit return. Still, overcast afternoon.

**Walk Two Sunday 28.10.12**

4:34 – 5:23pm | 49:42 | 4139 steps

From Studio to bridge over Rondout Creek return via rail trail. Overcast and light wind.

**Walk Three Monday 29.10.12**

3:03 – 3:45pm | 42:00 | 3201 steps

From Studio past Williams Lake on the rail trail. Returned via kilns and cement mine holes along the ridge. Rain and strong wind with Hurricane Sandy expected.

**Walk Four Tuesday 30.10.12**

4:23 – 5:25pm | 1:02:34 | 5212 steps

Drove from studio to Coetskill Rail Trail with Tana and Zoe the dog. Walked from car park to beaver dam return. Overcast and slight wind.

**Walk Five Wednesday 31.10.12**

4:37 – 5:29pm | 52:00 | 4416 steps

From Studio to Binnewater Lane kilns and cement mine holes via ridge trail. Returned via summit trail. Calm, misty and silent after the storm.

**Walk Six Thursday 1.11.12**

5:31 – 6:02pm | 31:00 | 3226 steps

From Studio to back of ridge, parallel to Breery Hill. Returned via lower ridge trail. Cold nip to the air and spitting rain.
