**LEE REICH'S
MARCH POTTING SOIL MIX**

- 2 gallons garden soil
- 2 gallons peat moss or sphagnum
- 2 gallons perlite
- 2 gallons compost
- mix thoroughly and sprinkle on top
- 1/2 cup lime
- 1/2 cup bone meal
- 1/2 cup soybean meal
- add a few sprinklings of kelp, ground rock powders such as green sand or rock phosphate, slide garden shovel underneath the pile and turn over
- watering the perimeter until the whole mass is thoroughly mixed and slightly damp.



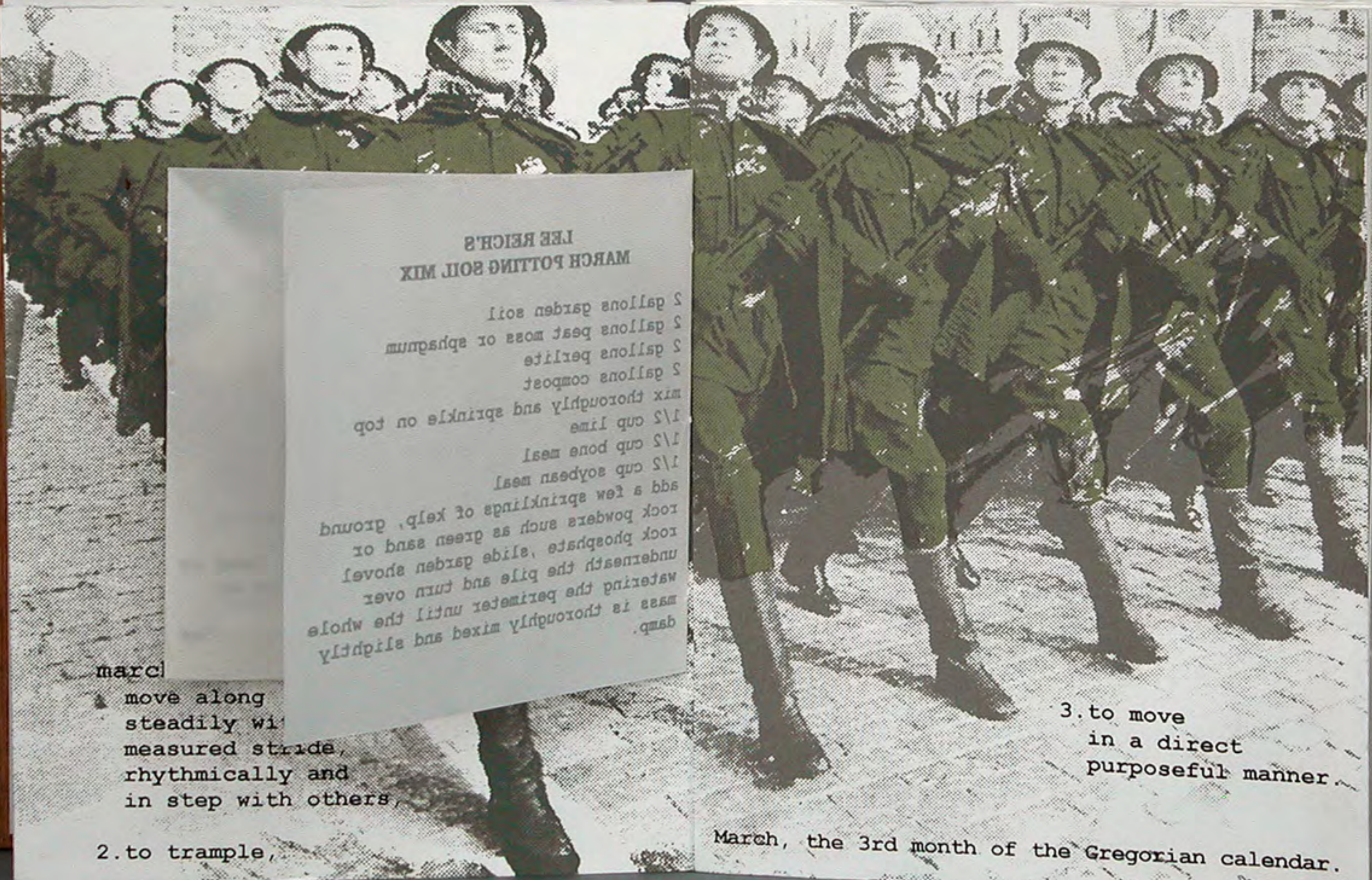

Lightning strike kills Sullivan woman 46

DIVINE CORNERS (AP) - A woman who was harvesting ripe garlic bulbs from her prized organic garden was killed by lightning, a newspaper reported Wednesday.

Patricia D'Auria, 46, died instantly when the lightning hit the ground near where she was kneeling, traveled through the garlic bulbs she was plucking and into her body, police said.

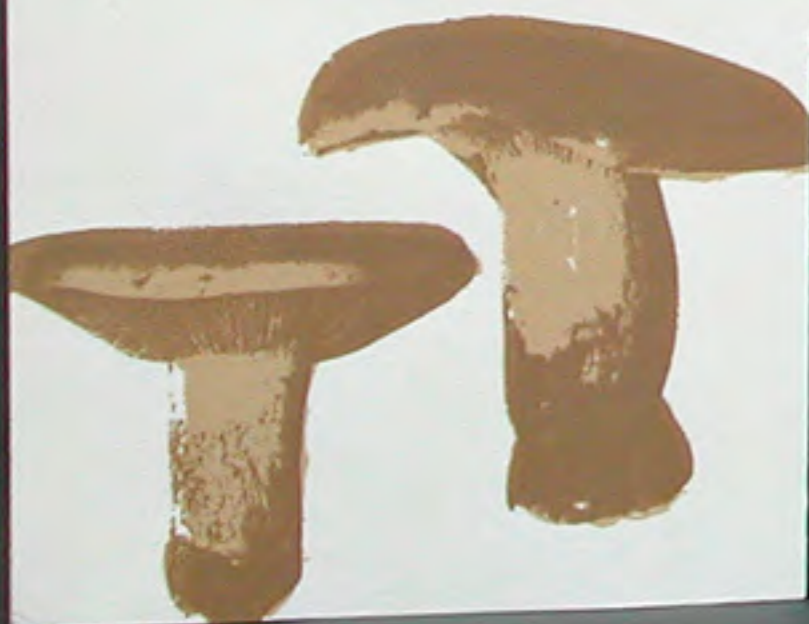
"It would have been just like she was sitting in an electric chair," Fallsburg town police Lt. Bart Rasnick told The Times Herald Record in Middletown.

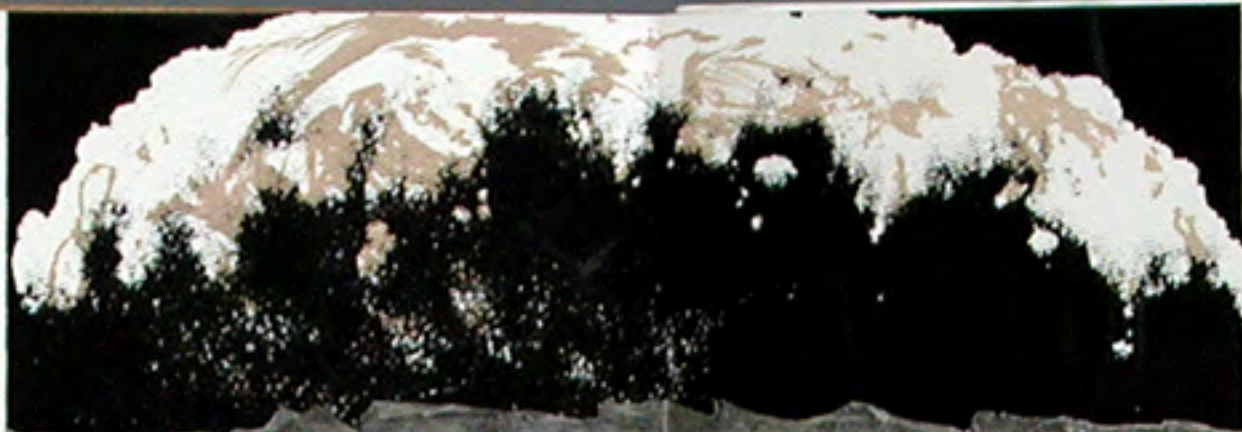

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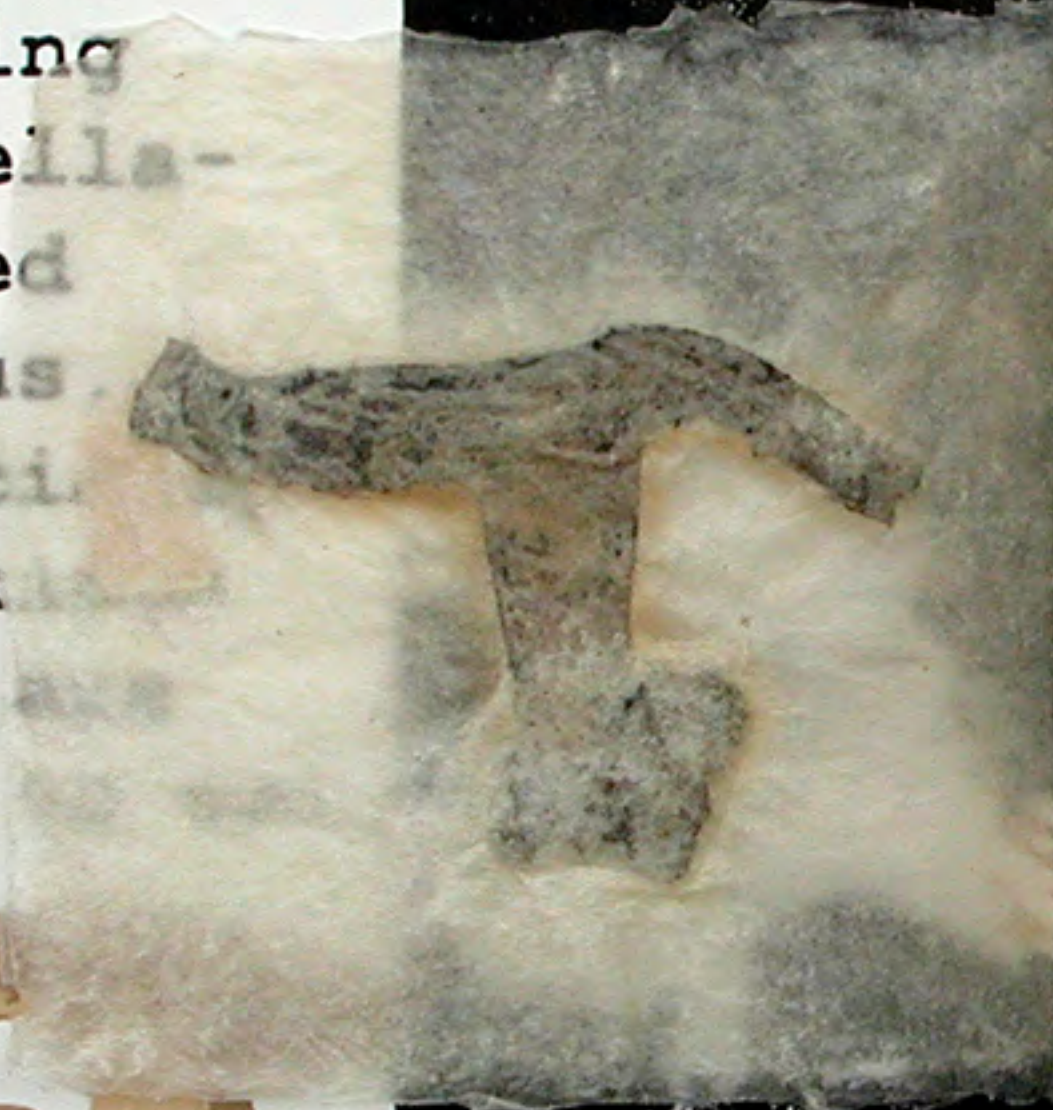

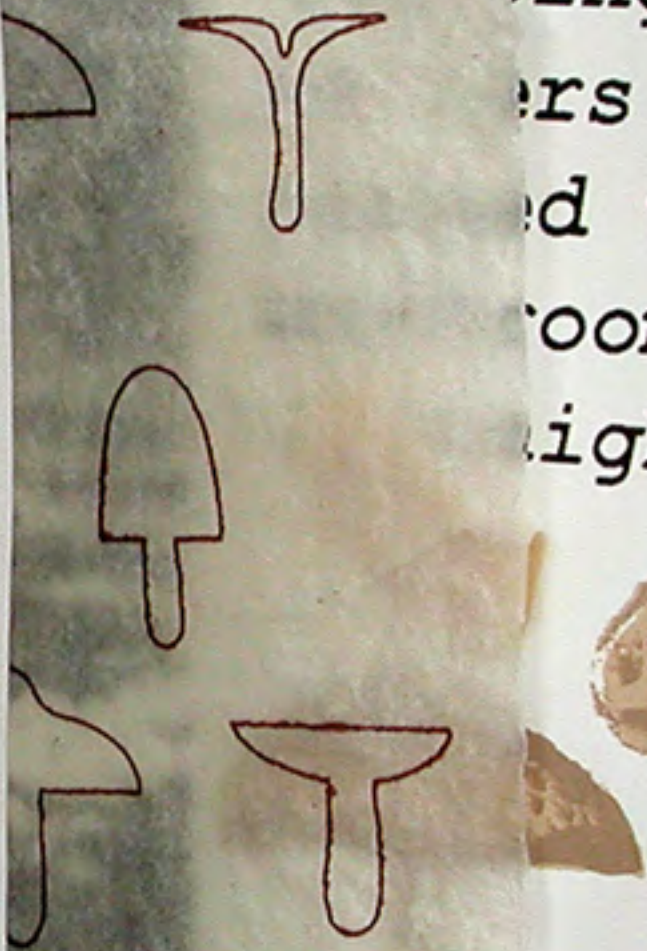

which run through the material on which the plant lives. Mushrooms do not contain chlorophyll and must obtain their necessary carbon compounds from other plants.



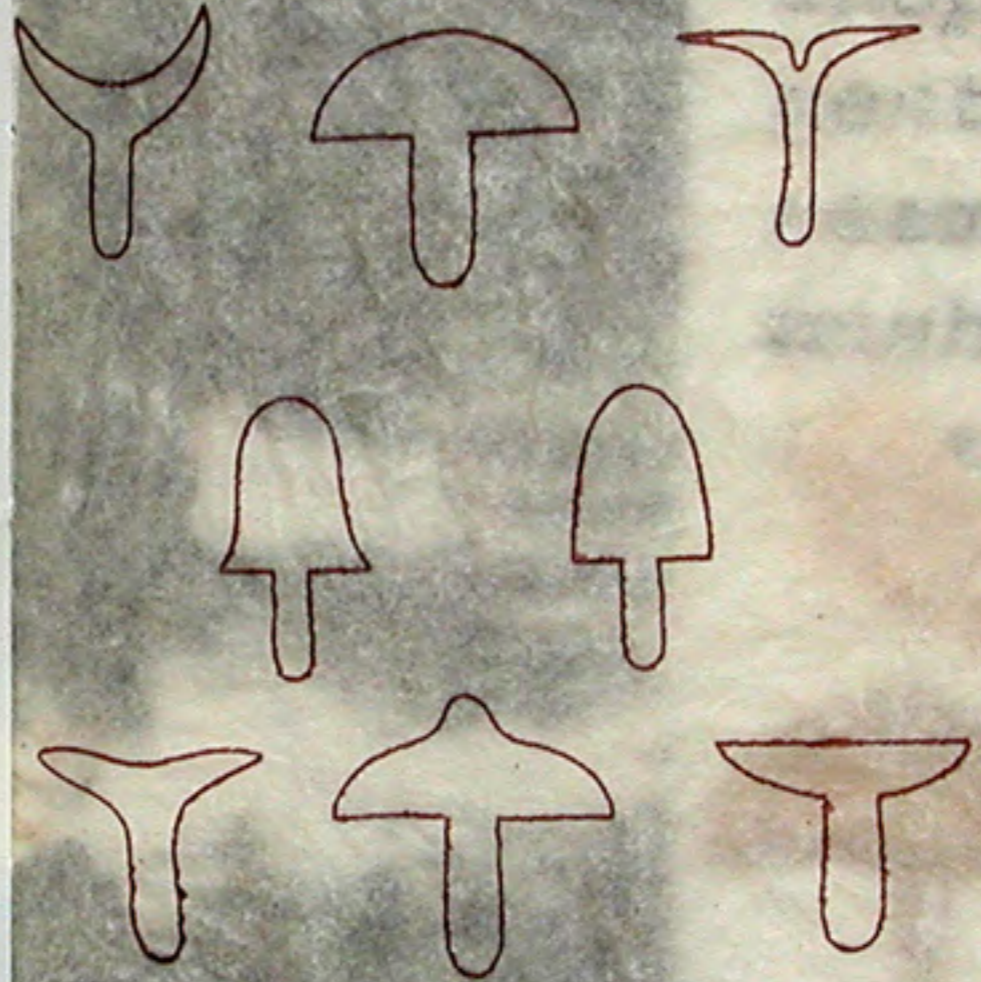
