Rosendale, NY — Join us for an evening of joint events: opening reception for Art-in-Education and Slide Night.

Women's Studio Workshop, in collaboration with Kingston City School District, are showcasing the work of local 4th and 8th grade students who came to our studios as part of our Art-in-Education program. With *Artist as Explorer* as their thematic guide, students used various printmaking and papermaking techniques to create a body of work that records personal and imaginative stories about exploration.

Art-in-Ed is a program that allows students to learn from working artists. This exhibition is an opportunity to see their work and our studios where it was created.

After the opening stay for presentations from artists-in-residence Trudy Barnes and Alison Owen, who will introduce us to their creative practice, backgrounds, and interests that inform their art. Artist presentations will begin at 6:30pm.

Women's Studio Workshop (WSW) is a visual arts organization in Rosendale, New York. Since 1974, WSW has brought over 5,000 artists from across the globe to work in the printmaking, hand papermaking, letterpress printing, photography, book arts, and ceramics studios. Over 6,500 Ulster County youth have participated in WSW's Art-in-Education program. WSW's artists' book grant program has published more than 200 artists' books, collected by special collections of major libraries and museums including The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The Tate Modern, and The Library of Congress, among others.
