- Thai Kozo Fiber
- PNS coagulant

**Participants should have:**

- Sketchbook or journal to take notes, make drawings, record inspiration
- Waterproof shoes
- Long waterproof gloves to rinse fiber (think dishwashing gloves, not disposable medical ones)
- Sharp knife to slice paper (x-acto or knife with snap-off blades)
- Straightedge (like a ruler, though my favorite tool is an aluminium triangle like <https://www.dickblick.com/items/alumicolor-aluminum-triangle-8-3060/>)
- Large needle or awl
- Spray mister (for water; can be a cleaned, re-used container)
- Small sumi brush (will only be used with water, so you can substitute with a water brush like <https://www.dickblick.com/items/pentel-aquash-water-brush-flat/>)
- Scissors
- Paper knife, Clip point knife, or bookbinders knife. (Talas carries western versions at <https://www.talasonline.com/search?keywords=paper%20knife> This is NOT an x-acto knife, razor blade, or scissors. This knife behaves like a mail opener, sliding against folded paper and tearing it cleanly)
- At least 20 wire brads (or get a box like this: <https://www.lowes.com/pd/Hillman-1-1-4-in-18-Gauge-Bright-Steel-Brad-Nails-1-75-oz/3010681>)
- Long upholstery needle (6 inches long) – instructor can loan if you don't have one

- *Optional* Self-healing cutting mat (any size, but not too tiny—at least the size of an A4 sheet of paper, 12x18" is easy enough to travel with and gives you room to work)
- *Optional* Knitting needles (any size and type) and/or crochet hook (any size) if you know how to knit or crochet and would like to do that with paper
- *Optional* Small container or plastic bag to store paper scraps
- *Optional* Small trigger clamp OR Large plastic spring clamp, wide enough to clamp onto a table (1–1.5" wide) but not so tight that you cannot open with one hand. This will secure strips of paper as you cord them
- *Optional* Drop spindle to spin paper, like <https://woolery.com/louet-octo-drop-spindle.html>
- *Optional* Antique Swedish bobbin winder if you have one
- *Optional* Small objects that are water resistant to cast. As with any casting, avoid undercuts unless you are willing to cut open your pieces
- *Optional* A flat rock that is easy to palm
- *Optional* Chip brush (1 or 2 inches wide)
